#### **Worship Service Updates and Changes**



With the State relaxing COVID-19 restrictions, your church council at their June meeting decided on the following worship changes. The council will continue to monitor CDC and State IDPH recom-

mendations and guidance for the next several months for changes that might impact how we conduct worship at Zion. We will keep you posted on any and all changes through e-blast and through these articles in the monthly Tidings.

The council has determined that the following procedures can be put in place as of June 16, 2021:

\*Updated signage on doors regarding mask usage. If vaccinated, no masks are necessary, but feel free to wear one if you feel more comfortable.

\*Cushions will be placed back in all pews.

\*Hymnals, bibles and hand sanitizer will be placed back in all pews.

\*Children's sermon – children will be invited to come to the steps for the message once again.

\*Sharing of the Peace will resume and you may participate with your chosen "twist". Shake hands, fist bump, elbow bump, flash the peace sign, sign language, etc.

\*Ushers will resume "normal" roles and responsibilities for services.

\*Friendship pads will remain at the back-entrance door for people to sign in each week as they enter church.

\*Offering plate will remain on the back table and be taken to the altar at the appropriate time during the service by an usher.

\*Communion will continue using kits at this time.

We are asking for your help in areas of worship and need your support in keeping our church events active and viable. Your support would allow all of us to keep and be a part of what makes Zion so special. By taking a turn, helps spread the work out and keeps all our volunteers fresh and wanting more. #### **Northern Illinois Synod Assembly**

took place on June 18-19 (via Zoom)

Affected by Covid-19, like everything else for the past year-and-half, this year the Synod Assembly was not held person-to-person. Zoom was the video platform used to "bring everyone together". This required two devices: a form of computer with a screen for viewing

and a smartphone to communicate election interaction via email. 327 voting members from across the Northern Illinois Synod attended.

There are advantages to meeting this way. Staying at home meant the accommodations were comfortable, the food was excellent and there were no long lines for the restrooms. Also, as Pastor Petersen pointed out, no one knew what you had in your coffee cup. Conversely, there are disadvantages. The omission of workshops and, the biggest of which, the absence of meeting and interacting with other members.

We worshiped together. Bishop Clements led the opening worship Friday evening focusing on love, grace, outreach, and reformatting. Saturday morning, worship was led by Pastor Janet Hunt from DeKalb focusing on the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women. A Bible study of Luke 24 was led by Rev. Dr. David Lose, senior pastor of Mount Olivet Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, and former president of Luther Seminary. He noted that all four Gospels point out that when the news of the resurrection was (and still is) first heard, it was not believed. Being physical beings, we (think) we need the physical resurrection. We learned about committees, agencies, and institutions via videos.

The usual housekeeping duties of accepting previous minutes, rules, reports, etc., was accomplished without incident before undertaking the constitution, two resolutions and elections. Video forums were held during the week examining each of those items. The constitution was approved, 98% - 2%, with two amendments. One limits a person to be elected to the same office no more than two consecutive terms. The other allows for the sharing of ministry between congregations who reside in different conferences of the Northern Illinois Synod.

The first resolution, "Addressing Anti-Semitism in Lectionary Readings", was approved, 96% -4%. This resolution deals with the confusing use of the word "Jew" and other words referring to a group of people or a religious belief, in the New Testament. Sometimes it is unclear of its use. This resolution requires a more appropriate word to be used when reading the scripture in public. A complete list of suggested substitutions will be compiled by the end of August.

The second resolution, "Support for the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act", was approved 89% - 11%. This resolution adds the support of Northern Illinois Synod and its congregations as an advocate for this act in a non-political manner. Elections were held for 53 positions. Only four were contested.

Our church-wide representative is Ms. Victoria Flood, Director for Mission Support, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The Jenny Lind Chapel and museum supported by the Northern Illinois Synod, "is a historic church located at the southwest corner of 6th and Oak Streets in Andover, Illinois. Completed in 1851 for a congregation founded the previous year, the church was the first built by the Augustana Synod, the main Swedish Lutheran church in America." (Wikipedia)

I wish to thank the congregation for allowing me to represent you and Zion. It is an honor and responsibility I do not take lightly. When voting, I considered what I thought would be the


