On June 13-14, Jeanne Marnen, Terry Miller, and Pastor Elizabeth attended the Synod Assembly as Zion's

voting members, and Wayne served as a guest and technical helper. We enjoyed great worship, good food, and fun fellowship with just under 400 people from our synod. Together we

- passed the Fiscal Year 2027 budget
- elected members to serve on the synod council and committees
- heard from guest speaker, Deacon Jessica Noonan, about listening and learning from our neighbors sighting the story in Acts 8 of Philip and the Ethiopian. "An enemy is someone's story you haven't yet heard."
- blessed those who will be voting members at the 2025 Churchwide Assembly
- celebrated congregations with 150 and 175-year anniversaries
- celebrated Rostered Ministers' anniversaries and remembered those who died this past year
- blessed the new synod paraments (see photo) The quilt blocks were assembled by 38 congregations, including Zion (thank you, Bonnie Wangen)
- passed the 2026 Rostered Ministers' compensation guidelines
- watched videos of Mission Moments great things that congregations are doing to serve their neighbors

Bishop Fidlar's address to us was, "What is your Why?" Before we find out

what, we must find out why. God has a why for each of us. They are opportunities to be the Body of Jesus for others. She commissioned us to show people how the cross of Christ changes us.

The assembly also adopted two Resolutions.

#1 A National Day of Remembrance for Indian Boarding Schools

This would be near September 30th. The resolution is based in the Indian day schools and over 520 Indian boarding schools from 1819-1969 where Native children were forcibly taken from their families and communities prohibited all expression of Native language and culture, and required to perform manual labor, with a goal to "Kill the Indian in him, and save the man."

#2 Northern Illinois Synod to Be a Reconciling in Christ Synod

Striving to reflect the expansive diversity of the Body of Christ, we welcome, celebrate, embrace, and uplift people of every race, national origin, immigration status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, age, disability, health and mental health status, neurodiversity, and socioeconomic status. We reject any other boundaries humans use that separate us from the body of Christ. Currently, 33 synods of 65 are RIC synods.

If you are interested in being a voting member for Zion, the congregation votes on who will attend assembly at Zion's annual meeting in January.
