### Prophets and Disciples

I was thinking about the fact that I have now been with you for two years. Time flies when you're having fun! My call to be at Zion comes from the synod council, and I am appointed by Bishop Fidlar. I also just attended the ordination of Leslie, the student whom I have supervised during her seminary journey. Both got me thinking about "call."

The prophet Isaiah acknowledged that he was not acceptable before God. A seraph (angel) takes a coal from the altar and puts it to Isaiah's lips to cleanse him from all sin and to make him ready to speak for God. When God calls, "Whom shall I send?" Isaiah responds, "Here I am, send me!" (Isaiah 6) Unlike some of the others called by God, namely Moses and Jeremiah, Isaiah is immediately *willing* to do God's work. Many others who are called have excuses and concerns about their call. We can certainly understand their fears and worries. God calms those fears by letting them know that God will go with them and equip them for this special mission.

The prophets' missions are similar to our lives of discipleship. Is being a disciple a job, or a response, or a call? Yes to all! Our lives of discipleship are rooted in the waters of baptism, where God claims us as children. The ritual of oil announces that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ. Just like the prophets, God chooses us, equips us, and goes with us in mission.

Sometimes the ministry that we are called to do is hard or even scary, like it was for the prophets of old. In my call, I have certainly, at times, bumped up against these feelings. Christ reminds us that we do not do these things alone. Not only is God with us, but God has also given us partners in ministry who help and uphold us. I have witnessed this in Zion's caring and faithful leadership and in the congregation.

Sometimes our mission means that we have to change or adapt in ways that are foreign or uncomfortable. Going to seminary and becoming a pastor was a huge transition in my life. God promises us new life in these moments and journeys of transformation. Perhaps you have experienced something similar as you have taken on a new role, participated in a different ministry, or way of serving. And maybe this has happened outside the church in your daily life. These opportunities stretch us and grow our faith.

Sometimes there is uncertainty about our mission and the ways we are called to be disciples. Zion is the fourth congregation that I have participated in leading. Each place has its own context in which to serve, specific resources and assets, and the opportunities to share the gospel can be met with challenges. The Holy Spirit promises to guide and direct our efforts as disciples. Zion is doing good work, and now you have the opportunity to imagine the future with your next pastor and the possibilities that God is calling you into together.

Being a prophet or disciple is not easy. If it were, we wouldn't need God – and yet we do. Thankfully, it is Christ who has gone before us, showing us what it means to be a witness for God's mission of love for the world. It is Christ who gave us the example of serving others in love and through his death and resurrection; it is Christ who goes with us as individual disciples and a congregation centered on mission; and it is Christ who will stir up the call in your next pastor as you extend it to them.


