From the Pastor's Desk

Resurrection and Relationships

On the Sunday after Easter, we hear the reading from the Gospel of John, where Jesus appears to the disciples, all but Thomas. He's known for doubting and not believing. Doubts are part of our faith journey, and that is another article. Believing, in the Gospel of John, is not so much about head knowledge, a doctrine or a creed, as it is about an abiding relationship. That is what Thomas is missing and what he longs to be rekindled, and we hear his joy in that relationship when he sees Jesus and exclaims, "My Lord and my God!" Resurrection has a power that bleeds into our relationships — with God, each other, and the created world.

I read a blog by Deb Koester on the power of resurrection in our relationships. She helped flesh some of this out, and I'll cite her comments in quotations.

Lives Transformed

Martin Luther asserts that in Christ's cross and resurrection, we are freed *from* the power of sin and brokenness in our lives and freed *for* lives of purpose living in God's kingdom on earth. "Our lives experience the ripples of transformative grace. We love because God first loved us." We become ambassadors of God's grace to comfort others in ways we have received comfort. (2 Cor 1:3-5)

Staying Connected to God

Without the lifeline of God's love in our lives, we are not able to propagate that love in our relationships. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. (John 15:4-5) "As we abide with the Spirit, our lives bear fruit that blesses our lives and also impacts the lives of others."

Lead with Grace

"As we begin to live as people who are transformed by the resurrection of Jesus, God's grace will leak out into all of our interactions." Maybe it's a conversation at work or with a stranger in the grocery store. Perhaps it is deeper as we work through forgiveness. God's grace seeps into our generous, caring, and helpful actions. Grace is the basis of our mission statement, *Sharing Christ's Love*.

Commit to Praying - Give it up to God

Relationships with others are not one-sided, and we alone are not in control. The Apostle Paul reminds us, *If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.* (Romans 12:18) "We cannot change the actions of others, and yet we are called to be responsible for our own actions." And so, we turn to God in prayer and trust these relationships to the nurture of God's grace. "Because of the resurrection, Jesus sits at the right hand of our Father in Heaven interceding on our behalf."

Trust God

The resurrection witnesses God's character and deep love for us. "Not only does God love us enough, but God is capable of doing what is beyond our power." And so, we trust God to lead us into healthy relationships, to restore broken ones, and by the Spirit kindle in us the desire to abide with others in their life situations because, in Christ's death and resurrection, he abides in us.
