The Holiest of Weeks

We are most of the way through the season of Lent now and headed again with our Lord, Jesus Christ, to his cross and resurrection. We turn to the holiest of weeks. It begins with Palm Sunday, also known as Passion Sunday, because it tells the story of the passion of our Lord. The ritual of palms goes back as early as the fourth century and wholly in the Christian church from the eighth century. We wave our palms on this special Sunday because they were waved in adoration of Jesus as he entered Jerusalem that last week of his life. Our worship service will include these palms and a blessing of them. Our gospel reading and sermon time will be exchanged with a reader's theater-style presentation of the Passion Narrative according to the Gospel of Luke. There are even parts for the congregation's participation. Reflecting on these words prepares our hearts and minds for the week to come.

Next, we move to the Triduum, which means "the three days." These holy days are Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter. The Triduum is one continuous long worship service, so when we leave on Thursday night, we then pick up where we left off, on Friday evening - in silence. We will observe the Thursday and Friday parts of the Triduum.

Maundy Thursday gets its name from the Latin word, *mandatum*, meaning "commandment." On this night, we hear the story from the Gospel of John, where Jesus serves the disciples by washing their feet and commands us to "love one another" (John 13:34). This is also the time of Jesus' last meal with his disciples before his death. So on this night, we celebrate a shared meal and an embodied symbol of serving. If you have never experienced Maundy Thursday, I urge you to come. It ends powerfully with the ritual of "stripping the altar," which means that all things are removed from the space as darkness sets in.

Good Friday begins in silence and meditation. Even though we gather around remembering our Lord's crucifixion, we do so as people of the resurrection. Since we know how the story ends, it is *Good* Friday for us. We will hold a service of Tenebrae in which candles are extinguished slowly between readings and songs. Tenebrae comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." On this night, we hear the Passion Narrative according to the Gospel of John. This gospel connects most to Jesus' divine nature and so we combine the emphasis on his divinity as we remember his human nature in death. We will not have Holy Communion because that is connected to a celebration of resurrection. The service ends with our attention drawn to the cross.

On the third day, he rose from the dead. Easter Sunday is a service in celebration of Christ's resurrection. We will sing our praises! We will again shout our "Alleluia's" that have been dormant this Lent. Celebrating all that God in Jesus has done for us will be a glorious morning. This service of resurrection gets its power from the days of the Triduum. We can sing our praises with such joy in our hearts because we have journeyed remembering Christ's last meal, suffering, and death in the days leading up to Easter. I encourage you to bring your families to as many of these services as possible. They are a gift to our ever-growing faith and life in the Christian community.

The time has come for us to begin the call process for a new pastor. With notice of Pastor Elizabeth's retirement, Council has appointed a team of church members who will, in faith and with grace, paint a literary picture of Zion Lutheran Church. 
