The Light that Guides Our Transitions

Epiphany blessings!

The Season of Epiphany began on January 6th, when we honored the arrival of the Magi, who came from faraway places to worship Jesus, bringing him gifts. This meeting became a sign that the light of Christ was to spread to the whole world. Some of the themes of Epiphany are light, baptism, and discipleship. The light of the star that led the Magi to Jesus pulls us into this season of light, where Christ is shown and revealed to us.

A few weeks ago, I headed out early in the morning, well before surrise, to be with someone before surgery. As I backed out of my drive and turned onto the street, my headlights shone across the lawn. I gasped at the site! The lawn looked like someone had sprinkled it with glitter. The lights shining through the morning darkness reflected off the frost in a magical array.

Often, even in scripture, darkness is considered in the negative. And yet, I think it to be a positive part of light being revealed, for I would not have seen the beauty of the frost without the darkness surrounding the festival of glitter. Without the chaos of darkness in God's creating, the light would not have been needed. And note that God does not do away with darkness; it is still half of our days and needed for life. The Magi could only see the star that guided them to Christ because of the contrast in the darkness, which reveals all the heavenly glories of our night sky.

The sun was rising as I entered my development on the way home from the surgery center that day. What a joy to be up and outside that early to witness a beautiful, colorful sunrise. Two fantastic displays of light in one morning. It gave me hope and encouragement for the day.

At our annual meeting, I announced my retirement on January 31, 2026. Wayne and I are excited to begin this next season of our lives and have many personal reasons for doing so earlier rather than later. I am also sad to share this news with you at Zion. We love being a part of this congregation! And we also feel so much love and appreciation from you. When I leave I will have been your pastor for two and a half years. I consider this time with you to be a great blessing.

So, what does this mean for Zion? You have spent the last year and a half healing. I hear you tell me how relieved you feel from the stress, that people talk and greet each other on Sunday mornings, and that Zion seems more unified. You have kept your mission at the forefront. Now is the time for you to begin a process called Transition. You will have a Transition Team to lead in this effort. They will guide the congregation through a process of identifying who you have been, are today, and are hopeful to be in the future. They will take the input and feedback from the congregation and devise your Ministry Site Profile. The synod will use this to identify prospective pastoral candidates, and it is what candidates will read to be informed about Zion. The next step will be the formation of a Call Committee that will interview the candidates.

This Season of Epiphany is fitting for you to enter this time of Transition. I know and trust that the light of Christ will shine through your process. The Holy Spirit will guide you as you prepare for your next called pastor. We will have a good year in mission together as we worship, serve, and learn. I celebrate the glittering light of this new dawn and the colorful sky of God's love and grace upon you this next year, knowing it will give you hope and encouragement.



Zion's 2025 Family Mission Trip



There will be a meeting on Thursday, January 30, 5pm-6pm at church.

Families are welcome, but youth can attend without parents.

When: July 13 - 18

Where: Crandon Wisconsin - North of Stevens Point 282 miles (less than

4.5 hours from church.)

This mission trip is mostly relational through Adventures in Missions. We will work with Midwest Indian Missions and help with their summer camp. The week-long camp

averages 50 children ages 8-13 from the Forest County Potawatomi and the Mole Lake Chippewa tribes. Our youth under 13 will participate in the camp while the adults and teenagers will assist with the camp counselors. Daily activities include games, crafts, music, and worship. Possible day trips to town for ice cream or swimming at the lake.

The teenagers and adults will work with the ministry host and the AIM Mission Leaders. (They do all the planning so we don't have to worry about that.)

Where do we sleep? Lodging is with a partner church in their camping cabins. (Bunk beds) Who: Anyone ages 7 & up.

Dads are welcome too! People are needed to referee the games. It's not all arts and crafts. How much: \$470 per person for the 6-day trip! This includes all food and activities. Any child 7-12 years old accompanied by a paying parent receives a 20% discount (\$376). This works for up to 2 children per family.

We have already started working on fundraising ideas to help with the cost. We need at least 15 people to attend. Please contact Jody Archer at 815-978-1691 if you are interested in attending.
