It is the moment in our lives where we are claimed as children of God charged to proclaim the faith – Jesus Christ crucified and resurrected. It is not school or life that shapes our vocation but Christ himself.

Our individual jobs and daily activities in the world identify and use the gifts we have been given, and our common vocation is to serve God through them. Doctors heal, social workers share resources, psychiatrists listen, farmers produce food, teachers educate, parents nurture, leaders equip - you get the idea. What gifts has God given you, and how will you use them in your vocation to serve God and others?

Alone, we cannot do these things. Only Christ in us gives us a pattern for living out our vocation as the baptized. God sends us to serve, care for, and help each other and all creation. And when we err, God picks us up, dusts us off, forgives us, and sends us out "wet" again. God equips us with gifts and passions to serve and a community of fellow believers to share Christ's risen life with the world.

Our office will change as we age, grow, learn, and have experiences and encounters in life. Our vocation, however, remains the same in all we do – living out our baptism. Congratulations to all the graduates! Peace and wisdom to those who are discerning change and the next steps. As you search for your office or live it daily, remember your vocation, vocation, vocation.


# Worship in the Park

Dear Zion Family,




