

Faithfulness

Last month, I presided at the wedding of Riley and Paige. There were no problems and everything went off famously. Not so for the wedding Wayne and I attended some years ago for the son of long-time family friends. They celebrated with us the weddings of both our sons, and we were excited to do the same with them. It was a Roman Catholic mass at an amazing, ornate Catholic cathedral. Everything was beautiful, and the service, including their vows and exchange of rings, went off effortlessly, until...the unity candle.

At the beginning of the service, each of their mothers took a long wax wick, lit them from the tea light at the back, and put flame to each of the side candles. The stage was set. The bride and groom walked over to behind the candles, looked lovingly into each other's eyes, picked up their tapers, and bowed them, at the same time, into the center of the large unity candle. They backed them out and realized there was yet no flame. Again, a second and third time, they tried to light this candle. The groom even tried to light it with just his candle.

The priest came over to lend a hand. He picked up the candle and poured out the liquid wax. Then he lit one of the wax wicks from their candles and tried, to no avail, to light this unity candle. I'm wondering how much the ritual would have meant had he succeeded. The priest repeated, dump wax, try to light, two times. Well, by now, there are giggles and murmurings in the assembly. I heard one person say, "Well, this isn't a good sign for their marriage." The priest was determined, and now his fingers were down inside fiddling with the wick. He tried one more time – no light. The groom picked up the tea light from behind and set it on top of the unity candle, and Voila! it looked as though it was lit. Everyone laughed and clapped.

The bride and groom worked so hard to get this candle lit the traditional way. It has meaning – the two coming together into one. The priest tried an innovation, still being faithful, using their flames, to get this candle lit. Finally, in the end, a complete and ultimate change in the way this candle has always been lit gave way to the unity of their marriage, represented in the flame of the tea light sitting on top of the candle.

I think this is a reflection of how we are in the church. We try hard to be faithful to the ministry that has been given to us to tend. Sometimes it requires that we change course and do it in a different way, and maybe we discern to stop doing a certain ministry altogether. To make a change is hard and at times doesn't seem faithful, righteous, or obedient. Perhaps it's just that change can be scary and hard work. It requires collaboration, consensus, and compromise.

I think the word here is faithful. We can worship, learn, serve, fellowship, and give in all sorts of different ways. Some traditions we hold onto, and we also embrace changes that give us new experiences and encounters with God and the people of God. We are faithful if we do these things with the love of God in Christ Jesus at the center. We are faithful when we think of what is best for others over ourselves. We are faithful when we do something in a new way, and it still reflects the love of Christ for us and in us.

Our faithfulness comes from God's faithfulness. The One who gave us our faith and the Church. God is with us in all things, encouraging us and giving us creativity and wisdom by the Spirit. I am reminded of the flames on that first Pentecost that moved and motivated the new Church.


giveaway that helped 175 families with 584 individuals with their food insecurity from the Boone County and surrounding area.

Our next food truck will be on a Wednesday, June 25th from




Altar Guild

- 4. Any envelopes not received before the bulletins are printed will say 'In honor of God's Glory.'**




Pioneer Luncheon
