But Now...

Last year at Synod Assembly, our keynote speaker was Rev. Dr. Charlene Cox. I was very intrigued and moved by one of her addresses to the assembly. I am basing this article on what she shared with us. Let's begin by reading Isaiah 43:1-3

¹But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel:
Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name, you are mine.

²When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

³For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

I read this passage to one who is ill earlier this week, as I have read it many times. At the end of chapter 42, God rebukes the people for the reasons that they end up living in exile. And in an about-face, God sees and hears their suffering and says, "But now—" This is a new and different word to them. It is not accusing or a rebuke. The past is now behind them, and the future is unknown. They are wallowing in the space in between. They wonder about the promises of God.

Into this, God says, "But now—" God speaks to them with intimate tender care. The people don't know what will unfold in front of them. God assures them that they are called, named, and claimed for God's purposes in the world ("he who created you, formed you, I have called you by name, you are mine.").

Is this still not true for God's people today? For Zion Lutheran Church? Whether we are talking in general about the past of the church that is gone, and the future that is not yet determined, or the transition taking place now – the Lord says, "But now-Do not fear, you are mine." You have a holy calling to be the body of Christ in this time and place. The whole of the future can be overwhelming, so we lean into God's calling for today. We can do this because God says to the exiles, "But now—. "

When we long for the past and fear or wonder about the future, God proclaims, "But now—I will be with you." When we question if we can do what the Lord calls us to, God says, "But now—I created, formed, and called you by name; you are mine." Our calling is to be the body of Christ in this world *today*. Will the metaphorical waters rise and rivers run quickly? Will there be the threat of fire? Yes, and God promises when we go through the hard stuff - the wandering, waiting, and wondering, God will not let the waters overwhelm us, and the fire consume us.

But now, good people of Zion, know that as your future unfolds, you are God's beloved – created, called, and claimed for God's good purposes in this world. And if we are God's, as God promises, our futures will also be held by God.




Faith Offering Notice
