On Eagle's Wings

The song in our hymnal, *On Eagle's Wings*, is a favorite for a lot of people and has been sung at many of the funerals over which I have presided. My mother even chose it to be sung at my Father's funeral in August. This is the refrain: "And he will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of his hand."

I invite you to read Psalm 91. The verses to the song are taken from this psalm. At the end of the psalm, it is God's angels that God will command to guard and raise up. The whole psalm is full of promise. In the midst of harsh situations – persecution, war, and disease – God promises to deliver. "When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble, I will rescue them and honor them." (Psalm 91:15 NRSV).

Now consider reading Isaiah 40. It is written when God's people, Israel, were in exile. There is comfort and reassurance that they will return home by God's hand. We hear the words at the beginning of the chapter during the Advent season. "A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low..." These are words of hope and promise.

Fast forward to the end, "The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:28b-31 NRSV)

On Eagle's Wings and these two Old Testament readings give witness to a God who is compassionate, forgiving, a rescuer, a promise keeper, devoted, and redeeming. Indeed, in times of trouble, we can trust in and call out to our God, knowing that God in Christ Jesus will attend us. God does not desert us but rather accompanies us through the struggles, "raising us up on eagle's wings and holding us in the palm of his hand." Even in death, our trust is in God, who grants us eternal life and will raise us up as God resurrected Jesus Christ, which is our Easter celebration and hope.

I am keeping you all in prayer and asking God to hold you, raise you up, and tend your broken places.
